This is a comprehensive course that covers all requirements to meet and maintain compliance, to work as a healthcare worker in palliative care. Along with the 3 core required subjects, this course introduces basic clinical tasks which are commonly seen in the palliative world.

We offer the opportunity to learn and practice basic clinical skills whilst promoting privacy and dignity.

The course has a strong focus on delivering care with compassion.

Day 1

- Moving and handling of a patient.
- Maintaining skin integrity,
- Pressure area care,
- Personal care,
- Effective communication
- Continence management.

- Hydration & nutrition
- Dysphagia (swallowing difficulties)
- Basic life support Cardio
 Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR),
 Adult, Child, Infant
- Airway & circulatory problems
- First Aid including choking for those with a disability

Day 3

- Awareness of relevant legislation
- Understand the need to control drug administration
- Management of PRN medication
- Knowledge of drug errors & adverse reactions
- Storing & disposal of medication
- Catheter awareness & catheter care
- Understanding of stomas & ostomy management
