The Springhill Hospice Palliative Care Education Passport

A 6 session course covering aspects of palliative care

Dementia Workshop

A full day course covering palliative care for those who have a dementia diagnosis.

Syringe Driver Training for Registered Nurses

This course includes symptom management, drug conversions and use of the Bodyguard syringe driver.

Learning Disability Workshop

A full day course covering palliative care for those with a learning disability.

Advance Care Planning

A full day course to equip healthcare workers with the skills and knowledge to empower them to facilitate advance care planning for those they care for.

Opening The Spiritual Gate

A full day course offering an opportunity to expand and explore the importance of providing spiritual care.

Foundations Of Care (3 sessions)

This course introduces the basic skills and knowledge to provide you with the foundations to provide palliative care.

The Springhill Palliative Care Education Passport (SPCEP) provides a solid set of holistic knowledge and skills for all grades of staff. It comprises of 6 modules, each exploring different aspects of Palliative Care.

The SPCEP is a course not only endorsed by Skills for Care, but also award winning!

Modules

- **Module 1** Advance Care Planning (ACP) recognising advancing disease and supporting individuals in distress
- Module 2- Communication Foundation skills for supporting those in distress
- Module 3- Psychological and spiritual needs for patients and families
- Module 4- Symptom management
- Module 5- Recognising dying and care at the end of life
- Module 6- Care after death and supporting the bereaved

The education team are all committed to making the sessions interesting and useful, by using group discussions and reflections, learners are able to develop their knowledge and skills in a safe environment. We promote person centred care by delivering learner centred education.

Costs: These sessions are **free of charge** for those who work within the Heywood Middleton and Rochdale area. For those outside of this area, the SPCEP can be completed for a charge of **£30 per session or £150** if all six sessions are paid in advance.

This is a full day workshop suitable for all levels of healthcare professionals in any setting,

Morning Objectives

- To gain awareness of the term `Dementia'
- To promote a person centred approach for individuals who are living with dementia
- To improve the confidence, knowledge and communication skills when caring for someone with dementia

Afternoon Objectives

- To look at how hydration and nutrition can be improved
- Introducing the rules of thumb a guide to aid with decision making in the palliative stages of dementia
- To increase awareness around best interest decisions

Syringe Priver Training for Registered Nurses

Essential training for all Nurses and Medical practitioners who use a syringe driver as part of their role.

The aim is to teach delegates the theoretical and practical skills required to safely and effectively use syringe drivers.

The course will teach delegates the importance of ensuring the machine is set up correctly before administering any medication through them.

- Recognise when a syringe driver is indicated
- Drug conversions and an understanding of common drugs used.
- Assessment and management of breakthrough pain.
- Loading procedure of the syringe driver.
- Recognise the common alerts and alarms, and their meanings.

Module Objectives:

- Discuss what palliative care is and strategic developments
- Have an understanding of palliative care needs for those with learning disabilities
- Awareness of the MCA and best interest decisions
- Understand why advance care planning is needed
- Understand the use of Proactive Indicator Guidance
- Discuss ways of supporting those we care for
- Awareness of the Individual plan of care for the dying person
- How to support and communicate
- Communication with the patient

Opening the Spiritual Gate' addresses the need for assessment of spiritual need and spiritual care, for all staff working in all healthcare settings

Course Overview

Understanding meaning

Meanings of spirituality and religion and the recognition of spiritual & religious distress.

Communication

Opening a conversation about spiritual and religious needs and helping to make a plan.

Recording & reporting

Concisely recording of the essence of conversations about spiritual and religious needs.

• Pulling it all together

Needs of different faith traditions, rituals, and rites of passage, spiritual and religious resources, spiritual care policies, standards and guidelines

Foundations of care in a palliative care setting



This is a comprehensive course that covers all requirements to meet and maintain compliance, to work as a healthcare worker in palliative care. Along with the 3 core required subjects, this course introduces basic clinical tasks which are commonly seen in the palliative world. We offer the opportunity to learn and practice basic clinical skills whilst promoting privacy and dignity.

The course has a strong focus on delivering care with compassion.

DAY 1

- Manual Handling (Covers manual handling required for mandatory training)
- Pressure ulcer awareness and how to support those with pressure relief
- Personal care and personal hygiene with patients of different abilities (Scenario practice)
- Peg hygiene awareness
- Care delivery ethos and communication

DAY 2

- Medication administration and the transcribing of medications
- Symptom management and PRN medication
- Administration of oral medication including covert medication
- Ostomy (Stoma) management
- Catheter awareness including hygiene management

VAY 3

- Basic Life support and Emergency First Aid at work (Covers mandatory requirements for 3 years compliance)
- Dysphagia including choking caused by dysphagia
- Continence management including the fixture of convenes and incontinence pads (including patients with flexion of the muscles and joints foetal position).
- Documentation
- Final scenario assessment (practical)
